Dear Friend of The Epiphany Group,

As you will recall, every three years The Epiphany Group asks for your generous gifts to continue the good work we accomplish. We are a Catholic interfaith Community of those seeking to explore current issues affecting our Church and personal lives, prayerfully responding to our baptismal call with “fresh eyes, open minds, and changed hearts,” by promoting social justice, education and advocacy.

Our last funding appeal was in October 2011, so it has actually been four years since we have written you. As you may know the last four years have been challenging for our group. We’ve lost an incredible number of our core members in those four years – Marian McUsic, Steve Eberle, both Frank and Mary Murphy, Terry Klein, Fr. Skeeahan, and Pat Ashe. And Jim McUsic’s health issues have limited his participation.
